2022 NYSAC Fall Seminar 1 2 **Standing Committee on Intergovernmental Affairs Resolution #3** 3 4 Resolution Calling on the State to Provide Funding to Counties and County 5 Boards of Elections for the Additional 2022 Primary, and to Provide 6 Flexibility for the Number and Location of Early Voting Locations 7 8 **WHEREAS**, county boards of elections are responsible for managing election 9 operations and paying for all or most of the costs of these operations; and 10 11 **WHEREAS**, election reforms in recent years have helped to strengthen our democracy, 12 by expanding access to voting through early voting, no excuse mail in ballots, and other 13 reforms; and 14 15 WHEREAS, many counties have reported very low turnout at some early voting 16 locations and have requested flexibility in both the number of required early voting sites 17 18 and polling locations to account for this low turnout; and 19 **WHEREAS**, due to the increased frequency of elections coupled with early voting, 20 21 counties are now required to hire poll workers as county employees and provide W-4's, rather than 1099-MISC's, which was the typical means for tax purposes; and 22 23 **WHEREAS**, because this year's congressional and state senate redistricting maps were 24 declared unconstitutional, county boards of elections had to expend funding, resources, 25 and personnel to plan for and operate two separate primary elections. 26 27 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the New York State Association of 28 Counties (NYSAC) hereby calls on the State to provide financial support to counties and 29 county boards of elections for having to operate two separate primary elections this 30 year; and 31 32 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, NYSAC also asks for the state to provide county 33 boards of elections with more flexibility when siting and operating early voting polling 34 sites to make the process more convenient and efficient without curbing access to 35 voting; and 36 37 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** Congress should reform the IRS "Election Workers – 38 Reporting and Withholding" requirements by amending Section 6041(a) which applies 39 to payments of compensation that are not subject to withholding of FICA or income tax; 40 and 41 42 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, this legislation should allow counties to issue 1099-43 MISC's for election worker earnings up to \$2,000, rather than the current statutory 44 requirement of \$600; and 45

- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be sent to the counties 1
- of New York State encouraging member counties to enact similar resolutions; and 2

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- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that NYSAC shall forward copies of this resolution to 4
- 5 The Governor of the State of New York, the New York State Legislature, the New York
- Congressional Delegation and all others deemed necessary and proper.
