- 8 WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has impacted every aspect of our society for a
- 9 year now and counting; and
- 10 WHEREAS, even as vaccines have been developed, approved, and deployed, the
- pandemic continues to spread across our nation, growing worse as measured by the loss
 of life, infections, infection rates and economic harm; and
- 13 WHEREAS, while Congress has enacted several important COVID response bills, there
- is still a tremendous need in every corner of the country and our state for more federal
- 15 resources; and
- WHEREAS, New York State remains one of the most deeply impacted states, in both
 the loss of life and economic harm; and
- 18 WHEREAS, counties and New York City are still projecting lost revenues in excess of 19 \$10 billion over the 2020 and 2021 fiscal years; and
- 20 WHEREAS, counties face an unprecedented quadruple threat of
- A significant decline in local revenues, especially sales tax, but also hotel
 occupancy taxes, mortgage recording taxes, gaming revenues, and other locally
 derived fees;
 - Higher spending necessary to respond to the national public health emergency;
 - Multiple years of reduced state reimbursement; and
- The potential of significant losses for small businesses on our main streets that could threaten jobs and the property tax base over the longer term; and
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- WHEREAS, without further federal assistance, the fiscal outlook for counties couldbecome more dire; and
- 31 WHEREAS, the New York State Association of Counties (NYSAC) thanks the New York
- 32 Congressional Delegation for its unwavering advocacy in support of providing more
- 33 federal resources including unrestricted direct aid to the state and its localities; and
- 34 **WHEREAS**, President Biden has submitted a new COVID response and recovery 35 package that includes \$350 billion in direct unrestricted aid to states and localities; and

WHEREAS, counties and New York City are the primary governmental units providing 1

the "boots on the ground" to protect and deliver services to New Yorkers during this 2

- pandemic; including: 3
- Maintaining public health facilities such as hospitals, clinics and nursing homes; 4 •
 - Administering and partially funding Medicaid on behalf of the state; •
- 5 6 Disease surveillance, monitoring, testing, and providing education to the public • 7 on how to practice social distancing and proper hygiene;
- Providing and coordinating the acquisition of PPE and other equipment; 8 •
- Providing mortuary services: 9 •
- Providing mental health educational resources to the public; 10 •
- Ensuring access to counseling and substance abuse services; 11
- Staffing and managing emergency operations centers that organize disaster 12 • response; 13
- Maintaining and staffing 9-1-1 systems that respond to urgent calls for help; 14
- Providing families in need with services including childcare, cash assistance, 15 emergency housing, responding to domestic violence situations, child abuse 16 prevention and protective services, elder abuse prevention and protection 17 services, food assistance (including SNAP enrollment and senior meals), energy 18 assistance (including LIHEAP enrollment), foster care, among others; 19

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, NYSAC calls on the New York State 25 Congressional Delegation to vote in support of providing all counties and states direct 26 unrestricted federal aid to combat COVID-19 and assist in the economic recovery; and 27

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the goal should be to provide funding to address 28 expected revenue losses over the next two years for New York state and its localities; and 29

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that additional direct aid will need to be made 30

available for the City of New York for its unique responsibilities as a city and county 31

under New York state law; and 32

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, population, with no minimum thresholds, should be 33 a key distribution criterion for this county direct federal aid; and 34

- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, federal stimulus legislation must also grant states 35
- and large counties that received funding under the Coronavirus Relief Fund as part of 36
- the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) the ability to use 37
- those funds to supplant revenue losses; and 38

- 1 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, copies of this resolution be sent to the counties of
- 2 New York State encouraging member counties to enact similar resolutions; and
- 3 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, NYSAC shall forward copies of this resolution to
- 4 Governor Andrew M. Cuomo and the New York State Legislature encouraging them to
- 5 support these and other federal recovery efforts, the New York State Congressional
- 6 Delegation and all others deemed necessary and proper.
