4 5	Resolution Urging the Enactment of an Increase in the Statutory CHIPS Bidding Threshold
6 7 8 9	WHEREAS , under current law, the local assistance funds allocated for local street or highway projects under the Consolidated Local Street and Highway Improvement Program (CHIPS) are used to undertake work on projects either with the municipality's own resources and workforce or by competitively-bid contracts; and
10 11 12	WHEREAS , when the estimate for the contract work exceeds \$350,000 the work must be competitively bid in accordance with the provisions for competitive bidding in the General Municipal Law; and
13 14 15	WHEREAS , regular incremental raises in the competitive bidding threshold for highway projects are necessary to compensate for increases in inflation impacting material, transportation, labor, equipment and other highway construction costs; and
16 17	WHEREAS , a recent increase in the competitive bidding threshold to \$350,000 is still below what many highway department professionals see as optimal; and
18 19 20	WHEREAS , the state legislature has supported an increase in the amount of the current cost threshold from \$350,000 to \$500,000 over which local highway and bridge construction work under the CHIPS program must be competitively bid.
21 22 23 24 25 26	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the New York State Association of Counties (NYSAC) supports the enactment of legislation or budget language that increases the CHIPS bidding threshold to give municipalities flexibility and the option to bid out or perform in-house projects that cost less than \$500,000. This will allow more opportunities for local governments to act to minimize the cost of its transportation projects on behalf of local taxpayers; and
27 28	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, copies of this resolution be sent to the counties of New York State encouraging member counties to enact similar resolutions; and
29 30 31	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the New York State Association of Counties shall forward copies of this resolution to Governor Andrew M. Cuomo, the New York State Legislature and all others deemed necessary.
