Last year, Broome County created a cooperative purchasing alliance with other counties and municipalities to leverage their purchasing power, reduce costs, and increase stability for retiree health coverage. Paying the Engineers: Preliminary Expenses, Additional Costs, and County Debt Issuance

Preliminary planning, engineering, or architectural expenses are often incurred before a county adopts a bond resolution for a project. If the county intends to reimburse cash advanced from a bond resolution to be adopted later followed by debt issuance, there are strict Local Finance Law and federal bond tax rules governing such reimbursement. This session goes over the options when initial costs (or additional new costs later in a project) accrue before a bond resolution is in place.
