2021 NYSAC Legislative Conference 1 **NYSAC Board of Directors** 2 **Resolution #2** 3 4 Recognizing the Observance of the Month of March as Women's History 5 Month 6 7 8 **WHEREAS**, March is Women's History Month, as declared by both the State of New York and by the Congress of the United States; and 9 10 **WHEREAS**, Women's History Month is a time to recognize not only the historical 11 contributions of women in our society but to also recognize and elevate the 12 contributions women are making every day in our communities; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the global coronavirus pandemic upended almost every aspect of our 15 society, and women often bore the heaviest burdens both professionally and in their 16 family life; and 17 18 **WHEREAS**, one in three jobs held by women has been designated essential; and 19 20 **WHEREAS**, according to a New York Times analysis of census data crossed with the 21 federal government's essential worker guidelines, more than two-thirds of the workers 22 at grocery store checkouts and fast-food counters are women; and 23 24 WHEREAS, women make up nearly nine out of 10 nurses and nursing assistants, a 25 26 majority of respiratory therapists and pharmacists, and an overwhelming majority of pharmacy aides and technicians; and 27 28 WHEREAS, these essential workers put their own lives at risk during the height of the 29 pandemic to ensure access to food, medicine and countless other necessities of life that 30 helped carry us through the darkest days of the pandemic; and 31 32 **WHEREAS**, millions of female essential workers accomplished this despite the 33 additional family pressures associated with motherhood, including caring for and 34 educating children who were required to stay home as schools and day cares closed; and 35 36 **WHEREAS**, sixty percent of Local Health Departments (LHDs) in New York are led by 37 38 women; and 39 **WHEREAS**, public health officials were the leaders of the local health response to 40 COVID-19 and worked around the clock for the last year to provide the public with 41 reliable information about the virus, administer mass testing and tracing operations, 42 and manage the distribution of vaccines to vulnerable populations; and 43 44

WHEREAS, they did this work at great personal sacrifice, enduring immense personal and professional stress as the public face of necessary, but often unpopular social distancing measures; and
WHEREAS, their courage, dedication, and leadership undoubtedly saved countless lives and helped place New York State on a trajectory to recovery.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the New York State Association of Counties resolves to observe the month of March as "Women's History Month" and to hereby honor the contributions of women, past and present, to our state.
