4 5 6	Resolution for Expanding Vaccination Access, Development of a Record Keeping Requirement, and Expanding the Role of Pharmacists in Vaccination Administration for New Yorkers
7 8 9 10	WHEREAS , local health departments are New York State's partners and operational extensions, working in the forefront of communities, addressing public health issues and protecting communities and residents from all public health crises, including COVID-19; and
11 12 13	WHERAS , New York State (NYS) does not require the reporting of all adult immunizations administered without consent of the person receiving the vaccine in New York State Immunization Information System or Citywide Immunization Registry; and
14 15 16	WHERAS , it is challenging to adequately strategize around adult vaccination coverage and reduce disease burden because of a lack of complete vaccination records for adults; and
17 18 19	WHEREAS , enabling decision support and facilitating targeted outreach to neighborhoods and groups that have low uptake would help ensure equitable access throughout NYS; and
20 21	WHEREAS , NYS has some of the most restrictive pharmacist vaccination laws in the country; and
22 23 24	WHEREAS , allowing pharmacists to administer all ACIP-recommended vaccines would improve vaccine coverage in the city and the state for critical vaccines such as COVID-19, hepatitis A, mumps, meningitis, pertussis, and measles; and
25 26 27	WHEREAS , pharmacists are convenient and trusted community providers who can improve vaccine access, particularly for underserved populations who do not have a primary care provider;
28 29	WHEREAS , the role of pharmacists should not replace recommended primary care provider visits.
30 31 32 33	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the New York State Association of Counties (NYSAC) calls on the Governor and State Legislature to pass legislation that would: 1. amend NYS Public Health Law (PBH) § 2168 to require health care providers,
34 35 36 37	registered professional nurses, and pharmacists to report to the NYS Department of Health, or, for health care providers located in New York City, NYC Department of Health, all adult immunizations administered without consent of the person receiving the vaccine; and

- 2. Expand pharmacist authority to permanently allow pharmacists to administer all 1 immunizations recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and 2 Prevention's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) to adults 18 3 years of age and older. 4
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be sent to the counties 5 of New York State encouraging member counties to enact similar resolutions; and 6
- 7 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that NYSAC shall forward copies of this resolution to
- Governor Kathy Hochul, the New York State Legislature, and all others deemed
- necessary and proper. 9
