- 6 WHEREAS, counties operate and maintain 9-1-1 and public safety communication
- 7 functions, including emergency dispatching; and
- 8 WHEREAS, current state public health law does not explicitly specify these
- 9 professions as "certified first responders;" and
- 10 WHEREAS, legislation introduced in both chambers of the legislature in 2020 sought
- 11 to rectify this law by amending section 3001 of the public health law; and
- 12 WHEREAS, the legislation would add public safety telecommunicators, emergency
- 13 responders, emergency operators, emergency complaint operators and emergency
- 14 service telecommunicators, who provide communication support services within police
- 15 and sheriff's departments as well as fire, rescue, and emergency service departments to
- 16 the public health law, specifying them as "certified first responders."
- 17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the New York State Association of
- 18 Counties (NYSAC) encourages the Governor and the State of New York to
- 19 immediately pass legislation expanding the definition of "certified first responders" to
- 20 include public safety telecommunicators, emergency responders, emergency operators,
- emergency complaint operators and emergency service telecommunicators, who provide
- communication support services within police and sheriff's departments as well as fire, rescue, and emergency service departments to the public health law, specifying them as
- 23 rescue, and emergency service departm
 24 "certified first responders;" and
 - 25 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that copies of this resolution be sent to the counties 26 of New York State encouraging member counties to enact similar resolutions; and
 - **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that NYSAC shall forward copies of this resolution to
 - 28 the Governor Andrew M. Cuomo, the New York State Legislature, and all others deemed
 - 29 necessary and proper.
