2022 NYSAC Fall Seminar 1 2 Standing Committee on Agriculture & Rural Affairs **Resolution #2** 3 4 Resolution Calling on the New York State to Commence an Investigation 5 6 into the Closure of Bank Branches in Rural Counties in New York State 7 8 WHEREAS, bank branches in rural counties provide consumers with a financial institution where they can make deposit or withdrawal transactions to their accounts, 9 take out a loan, select a mortgage lender, dispute a fee on their accounts, and perform 10 other in-person financial transactions; and 11 12 **WHEREAS**, the presence of bank branches in rural counties also provides an 13 important source of financial advice, civic leadership, and a more personal touch by 14 their financial service providers; and 15 16 WHEREAS, counties across the country and throughout New York State have been 17 deeply affected by the steady trend of bank branch closures, which disproportionately 18 affects rural counties; and 19 20 **WHEREAS**, while a growing number of consumers with bank accounts are adopting 21 online and mobile banking for the primary function of checking their balances in their 22 accounts, bank branches in rural counties continue to be a necessity for consumers, 23 especially for deposit and withdrawal transactions, and for resolving problems with 24 their accounts; and 25 26 **WHEREAS**, while improvements in technology and remote access have helped some 27 consumers access online and mobile banking services, many rural counties are unable to 28 provide their consumers access to broadband internet and cellular phone service that is 29 sufficient, reliable, or affordable, creating a roadblock to banking activities; and 30 31 **WHEREAS**, although non-bank financial service providers are filling critical service 32 gaps provided by bank branches, they are not meeting all the needs, or are doing so at a 33 higher cost to the consumers; and 34 35 36 WHEREAS, small business owners, seniors, and those lacking consistent and reliable transportation are most negatively affected by bank branch closures; and 37 38 **WHEREAS**, the elimination of bank branches in rural counties is a loss to the affected 39 40 communities' financial and civic leadership; and 41 WHEREAS, adjusting to the loss of a local bank branch can be frustrating and 42 disruptive to the affected communities and their consumers; and 43

WHEREAS, the closure of local bank branches each year in rural communities is an 1 ongoing issue, and there is no reason to believe that this trend will dissipate without 2 appropriate intervention; and 3 4 **WHEREAS**, the counties are gravely concerned that the closure of additional local 5 bank branches will place communities and their consumers in a state of hardship if New 6 7 York State does not commence an investigation into this crisis. 8 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the New York State Association of 9 Counties (NYSAC) calls upon the Governor and the New York State Legislature to 10 investigate the closure of bank branches in rural counties in New York State; and 11 12 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that copies of this resolution be sent to the counties 13 of New York State encouraging member counties to enact similar resolutions; and 14 15 16 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that NYSAC shall forward copies of this resolution to the Governor of the State of New York, the New York State Legislature, the 17 Commissioner of the Department of Financial Services, and all others deemed necessary 18 19 and proper.
