4 5	Resolution Commending Proposed Changes to the County-Wide Shared Services Initiative, and Urging Lawmakers to Make it Optional
6 7	<b>WHEREAS</b> , counties have long used shared services and departmental consolidations as tools to improve local government efficiency; and
8 9 10	WHEREAS, since 2011, the State has enacted a series of laws requiring local governments to reduce property tax increases and find new opportunities to share services and reduce costs at the local level; and
11 12 13	<b>WHEREAS</b> , these laws included the property tax cap enacted in 2011, the Government Efficiency Program enacted in 2014, the County-Wide Shared Services Initiative (CWSSI) enacted in 2017; and
14 15 16 17 18	WHEREAS, in the 2017-18 State Budget, the County-Wide Shared Services Initiative called for county leaders to convene panels of local government leaders to develop new shared services and consolidation proposals designed to reduce the burden of local property taxes and leverage a state match of savings achieved through these proposals; and
19 20 21	WHEREAS, in the 2018-19 State Budget, state leaders extended the requirement that counties convene these shared service panels in 2019, 2020, and 2021 to explore additional opportunities for local shared service projects; and
22 23 24 25	<b>WHEREAS,</b> since then, counties have been required to spend resources, time, and funding to coordinate these shared services panels, including in some cases hiring additional staff members, or contracting with research agencies or consulting firms; and
26 27 28	<b>WHEREAS</b> , this year's proposed 2021-22 Executive State Budget makes the CWSSI permanent, requiring counties to convene these local government panels each year; and
29 30 31	<b>WHEREAS</b> , the proposed spending plan also re-appropriates over \$200 million for state matching funds for savings achieved through the CWSSI and proposes new flexibility to leverage those savings if they are achieved in later implementations.
32 33 34	<b>NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,</b> the New York State Association of Counties (NYSAC) applauds the Governor for increasing the flexibility of the CWSSI; and
35 36	<b>BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,</b> NYSAC calls on state lawmakers to incorporate these changes for counties who undergo the CWSSI process, and make the process optional

- for counties who are not able to convene local government panels in any given year;

- 3 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that copies of this resolution be sent to the counties
- of New York State encouraging member counties to enact similar resolutions; and
- 5 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that NYSAC shall forward copies of this resolution to
- 6 Governor Andrew M. Cuomo, the New York State Legislature, and all others deemed
- 7 necessary and proper.
